We picked the area that showed possible features on the resistivity and took measurement on a half-meter grid to see if there was any better resolution. This is all good learning for the group so that we know how to plan future surveys andmore of ourmembers gain experience with the equipment.



With 4 times as many readings it takes much longer to do the survey at this spacing.
