

St. Tydfils closes its doors

This church was one of the many benefactions of Miss Emily Charlotte Talbot, who had committed herself to pay for the church (£5500) also the parsonage (£1100) and the church hall built in 1915 for (£760). The church was completed in 1902. The main church building was demolished in the mid 1990's, due to waning numbers with the services continuing in the church hall. Sadly for the remaining members their numbers had fallen recently and it had to close its doors in April 2018.
