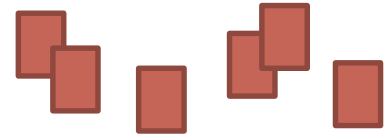

Place

Designated an **Air Quality Management Area** due to levels of nitrogen dioxide and particulate matter



10 Wandsworth **Primary schools** are in areas that exceed the legal air pollution limits.

Only 18% of Wandsworth residents **own their home outright**; average price of a property is £577,000.



Start well

10,385 children in low income families

1 in 3 children leaving primary school aged 10-11 years were overweight or obese



12% of 15 year olds partake in 3 or more risky behaviors

1 in 4 children aged 5 have one or more **decayed, filled or missing teeth**



14% the percentage point gap in attaining a **good level of development** at the end of reception for children with free school meals, which widens to 24 percentage points by key stage 2

100 out of 2,600 female babies born to women with FGM per year.

Live well

35,000 adults smoke



44% of adults drink more than the recommended limit of 14 units of alcohol per week



More than **half** of over 16's are overweight or obese

Over **19,000** carers



15,000 residents living with diabetes and another **25,000** who are on the verge of developing it.

44,000 people estimated to have a common mental health disorder, such as depression and anxiety



4,950 new STI diagnoses (excluding Chlamydia <25)

Age well

Average person can expect **15 years** of deteriorating health in old age



1/5 are on low incomes

9,000 over 50s are unpaid carers



794 hospital admissions due to falls

3,420 people aged 65 and over living with visual impairment



1 in 4 victims of recorded fraud for those aged 65 and over.
