FUNDING

Mayor of London call for applications: micro grants for supporting outreach work with European Londoners

The Mayor of London is committed to supporting European Londoners in the light of the UK leaving the EU. As part of this work, he will be supporting civil society to engage with European Londoners about the Government's proposed Settlement Scheme and reach out to those groups most at risk of marginalisation. A pilot micro grant scheme has now been launched to support this important work.

City Hall will provide micro-grant funding of up to £2,000 to community groups and small civil society organisations with demonstrable expertise and reach to deliver outreach activity on the settled status scheme, providing information and advice to vulnerable European Londoners.

Integrated Communities Innovation Fund

The new Integrated Communities Innovation Fund is now open to expressions of interest from applicants. In partnership with Sport England, the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government is calling for applications to the new Integrated Communities Innovation Fund. The first stage invites short expressions of interest by **11.45pm on 20**August 2018.

The Fund will help drive forward the proposals to tackle the key causes of poor integration set out in the government's Integrated Communities Strategy green paper, by offering support to projects using innovative approaches to tackle the barriers to integration and build integrated communities. The Fund will build our understanding about what works to support integration in different community contexts.

BUILDING CONNECTIONS FUND

Funding size: £30,000 to £100,000 - Main fund: Close to £9 million
Application deadline: Main fund: **Friday 24 August by 12 noon**. Awards will be made by
December 2018 and projects can be funded until March 2021

This fund is all about tackling loneliness for adults and Elders; and there is a strand for young people too (in conjunction with Sports England). It aims to:

- increase social connections, helping people form strong and meaningful relationships and creating a sense of community and belonging, and helping people feel more connected;
- support organisations to build on their existing work, eg. by reaching more people, or working in a new area or with a different method or group of people;
 - encourage organisations to join up with others locally;
 - improve the evidence base and use learning to inform longer term policy and funding decisions.

Partnerships with statutory bodies are welcome though the project lead would need to be from the voluntary and community sector. To find out more, go here:
