Your neighbourhood priorities

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) priorities are set in consultation with the community through the Neighbourhood Tasking Groups (NTGs). This means we can focus on those issues that are important to you.

Melksham Town Beat

PC Fullbrooksmith

Anti- social behaviour (ASB) and underage drinking was a priority in the area of the Forest Estate. There has been 10 hours of targeted patrols in the area which has deterred ASB with the odd reported incident. In the Town Centre four young people have been identified for causing ASB and with the involvement of Wiltshire Council ASB Officer. the NPT are looking to issue ASB Contracts before issuing formal warnings for ASBO's. Begging has become an issue recently and this is going to be set as the next NPT priority. One male has already been arrested and we will continue to work in partnership with our external partners to reduce crime and ASB in and around Melksham.

Melksham Rural North Beat

PC Barry Dalton:

Back in October and November Melksham NPT were getting reports of young people emptying dog waste bins and throwing the contents at passing cars. Incidents were reported along the A3102 near the newly developed estates as well as along Lowbourne. The issue was prioritised and targeted patrols

by officers were carried out. A small group of young people were challenged over the incidents and along with other associated reports of ASB they were issued with antisocial behaviour contracts handed out by Wiltshire Council in conjunction with the NPT. It is good to be able to report that since our intervention we have not had any further reports of this kind of ASB.

Melksham Rural South:

Over the past few months we have been proactively patrolling farms. There have been a few arrests over thefts and burglaries with offenders currently on bail. The new priority currently being worked on is trying to get a reduction in the speed limit as you enter Great Hinton from the A361 Lamb on Strand end. It has been highlighted by residents that since the change in limit the road is now marked up as a 60mph making it dangerous for road users and local residents. The area boards have been notified and we are working together to see what options are available. Speed check patrols will also be carried out.

FARM WATCH AND HORSE WATCH

Farm Watch and Horse Watch was set up to reduce opportunities for crime and vandalism, strengthen community spirit so that everyone can play a part in protecting their property, improve two-way communication between farmers and the police and reduce the fear of crime.

The rural crime team can arrange security marking, and security surveys for your property. The text alert system they off has proved very popular with farm watch, once registered you will get the latest crime information when thefts occur. If you are a famer, small holder or feel this would be beneficial please contact your local officer or PCSO to make sure your details are registered.

We also visit local groups and organisations to explain more about neighbourhood policing and listen to your concerns. Please contact us to arrange a visit.


