Notes from Bacton & **Edingthorpe Parish** Council

The Council has received feedback from the owner of The Duke Public House, in which they conclude 'There are only two viable options for the future use of the site. The first is to develop the whole site with change of use to residential and the second being leased for a long-term let to an experienced and financially sound operator who would glean revenue from all areas of the premises.' They also state that comments from various authorities as well as departments of NNDC in full general support development of the site to residential as opposed to obstruct the roadway. leaving the pub empty to The Council has been stagnate further.
