senior. He enlisted in January 1916, as a Driver Mechanic, stating that he was about 7 years older than his actual Despite a slight hernia, he was considered fit for the Army.

On 4th May, 1917, the Hospital Ship Transylvania was carrying Allied troops to Egypt when she was hit by a torpedo fired from a German U-boat when she was about 2 miles south of Cape Vado, near Savona, in the Gulf of Genoa. One of the accompanying Japanese destroyers came board, but was forced to take evasive action when a second torpedo was fired some 20 minutes after the first. This hit Transylvania, which sank immediately, with the loss of 10 crew members, 29 Officers and 373 soldiers. Transport Edward was awarded the Army Service British War Medal and this, along with his Death Plague and the Commemorative scroll. were sent to his widow, in August 1945.
