### **Bacton & Edingthorpe Parish Council Meeting 10 April 2017**

Volunteers are urgently needed for this community initiative. Without DBS checks in place early on, Multisports may not be able to continue in 2017. It is vital that you inform us in advance of your wish to help. We need a minimum of 3 volunteers per session per week; so we are seeking a total of 6-10 people in order that we can accommodate holidays and illnesses. In this way, the workload does not fall on one person's shoulders. Please volunteer now - we need you.

It is superb to see the Gardening Club filling up the planters with flowers - in due course they will be over flowing with colour and we hope that this will

continue throughout the seasons. Thank you to the volunteers who have contributed to this initiative and who will continue to maintain them. The Council would like to extend its thanks to the land owner and farmer for the work which they have completed at Edingthorpe Pond. You have done a fantastic job and we hope that this will have an impact on the local environment.

## Environment Agency Flood Warning System

Floodline Warnings Direct (FWD) has been replaced by a new and improved flood warning system (FWS) which went live from 10th April 2017, weather permitting. It switches directly over from the old system so there would be no time where we do not offer our flood warning service. Existing customers of the service will not need to take any action, but when the new system is available you may wish to go online to check your online account, review your details and add new features. There will be no change to our flood warning codes. The new flood warning system will send warnings mainly by telephone, text or email. It will no longer support messages sent via fax or pager. You may notice that the content has changed slightly. The Quickdial codes for each Flood Warning Area are also changing. You will be able to log in to your account to see what your new Quickdial code is, or you can wait until you receive an Alert or Warning to be provided with this information.

In the new system, you'll be able to directly choose and receive warnings for different locations for anywhere you are interested

in. This could be a holiday location, somewhere you are travelling to or an area where relatives live, for example.

The new linked telephone system will also be able to recognise your location and history when you call Floodline. If you are calling from a landline, or you have used the service before, it will know which location you are calling about and direct you to the recorded warnings which relate to that location.

If you are currently registered to receive flood warnings you don't need to make any changes, but you might want to use the opportunity to log in to your account to check it's all up to date and explore the new features.

### 2 Minute Beach Clean

Brought to Mundesley through the enthusiasm of local villager Kathryn Moore, sponsored by Coach Cottage Holiday Cottage and managed by Mundesley CoastWatch, the new #2minutebeachclean Station was unveiled by Norman Lamb MP to the approval of a small crowd of passionate supporters.

A 2 minute beach clean might seem insignificant in the grand scheme of things, but it is very important. Every piece of plastic that is removed from the marine environment is no longer a danger to the animals that still live there. Polystyrene debris is frequently to be found strewn across our beaches, breaking down into smaller and smaller pieces until it resembles fish eggs. Land and marine animals mistake plastics for food and eat it. Earlier in the year scientists in Norway found more than 30

plastic bags and other plastic waste inside the stomach of a stranded whale. Entanglement from discarded nets, fishing lines and balloon ribbons cause strangulation and injury to marine and bird species. Michelle Duddy, who regularly organises beach cleans across Mundesley, Sea Palling, Bacton and Walcott is only too aware of the amount of beach pollution. "In 2016 from 31 beach cleans, approximately 976.1 kg of rubbish was collected! Mainly plastic bottles, polystyrene takeaway boxes and cups, polystyrene fish boxes, cotton bud tubes, baby wipes, rope and ghost gear (derelict fishing gear). Nurdles (small plastic pellets about the size of a lentil) and Styrofoam litter the tide lines too. The

problem is ongoing. We rely on the goodwill of the public to help beach clean whether it is individually as a #2minutebeachclean or as part of an organised beach clean."

The #2minutebeachclean Station has its origins in 2009 when Martin Dorey and Tab Parry started The Beach Clean Network Limited a not for profit organisation to encourage beach cleaning. Following the winter storms of 2013/14 beaches all over the UK were littered with plastic - hence the #2minutebeachclean Station came into being. Currently there are 77 Stations across the UK but only two in East Anglia - Mundesley being the second. The first was pioneered in North Norfolk by Louise O'Shea who runs the West

Runtun Beach Café. There, the benefits have been noticeable: “Firstly everyone, young, old, families and school groups all enjoyed their #2minutebeachclean and thought it was a brilliant idea. The best thing for us was the real difference it made to litter on the beach. West Runtun is a safer bathing beach. Whilst collecting water samples for bathing quality testing, the Environment Agency also takes note of how busy the beach is and if there is any visible litter. On several occasions zero litter was recorded. This was an amazing result for us and proof that the #2minutebeachclean Stations work.”

Cllr Angie Fitch-Tillett, Cabinet Member for Environmental Services, said: “This initiative is a great way to get everyone involved in keeping the

coasts clear of litter. Whether you’re supporting a beach clean near where you live or visiting North Norfolk from further afield, this reminds us all to care for the environment as well as enjoy it. North Norfolk District Council is pleased to be able to support such a good project. On the day of launch, users of the #2minutebeachclean station were already posting their efforts on Instagram. Visitors to Mundesley, Jude (12) and Leilani (10) Elliott-James were very happy to help beach clean and would happily do it again when they next stay in the village. ### St Peter's Church, Ridlington

April is a month of annual PCC vestry meetings throughout the coastal group. It is interesting that, prior to the 1850's, a body known as the Select Vestry performed the dual role of PCC and Parish Council. 'Select' meant select persons (usually property owners, who were co-opted onto the committee) and

was chaired by the local Incumbent.

The main concern of the Select Vestry was the distribution of the parish rate or tax and in those days the poor were the responsibility of the parish. A Select Vestry meeting notice dated May 11th 1822 in the village of Wolvey in Warwickshire gave some insights into village life at that time. No relief was to be given to the poor keeping a dog and a distinction was to be made between the industrious and prudent and the idle and profligate poor and last but not least any women giving birth to an illegitimate child could be punished with up to 12 months' imprisonment - no mention of the man involved.

Returning to the present day, our next service is on the 7th May at 3pm and is in celebration of spring and the natural world.

Just a footnote: in 1879, to be buried 4 feet deep would cost you 3 shillings and 9 pence but for the luxury of an extra foot would cost an extra 1 shilling and sixpence.
