Interconnector Venting Incident 11 October

During planned maintenance on the electrical systems, the plant experienced a fault, causing power to be lost. The Interconnector terminal is designed so that, when power is lost, the systems and equipment shut down and automatically vent the terminal in a controlled way, using a designed vent system. This is what happened on Tuesday, October 11.

We appreciate that the sound of the gas venting was loud and wish to apologise to people living and working near the Bacton Gas Terminal for any disturbance or concern caused.

**Bacton & Edingthorpe
Parish Council Meeting 10
October 2016**

The Members could not believe that we are already focussing on the Bacton &

Edingthorpe Children's Christmas Party after just recovering from the end of Multisports!!

This community event will be held on Saturday 3rd December at Bacton Village Hall and will be managed by our volunteer - Sally Dunham to whom we thank. Funding for this is usually via the Gas Terminal Companies with the Parish Council topping up the difference as necessary.

At the last meeting a member of the public drew the Council's attention to the possibility of the loss of the Bacton School Crossing Patrol service from the County Council. This matter has been taken up by Northam Wyndham, who has advised that, at the present time, no decision has been made on any individual sites. Norfolk County Council will be reviewing this service in November, when a consultation process will be taking place.

On 28th April 2016 the site was monitored. There were 149 vehicles (5 per minute average), 37 children

crossed (2 per minute average), of which only 6 were unaccompanied, between 8.30 and 9.00am. There were only 2 heavy goods vehicles in this time. The patrol site also has flashing lights. The location will be re-monitored before the November meeting of the County Council, when which schools' footfall meet and those which do not meet, the national thresholds and on what basis will be assessed. This situation is being monitored closely by your Parish Council.

If you have any ideas/projects or any comments regarding the management/running of your Council, please let the Clerk know.

Voluntary Norfolk

Jonny Wood and Natalie Hickman, Voluntary Norfolk's co-ordinators in North Norfolk, run the North Norfolk Health Volunteers scheme, a befriending service run in partnership with North Norfolk Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG), which links volunteers with people who are experiencing long term health conditions which leave them socially isolated and less able to participate in their local community.

Depending on what volunteers wish to offer, it could involve a simple coffee and chat, a short walk, a game or craft activity, a quick hand with something in the house or garden or even a short trip out in the car.

Although Christmas is often the focal point for many people experiencing loneliness, it is a year-round problem so people across North Norfolk and Broadland are being encouraged to become part of the solution. People often enquire about getting

involved as Christmas approaches, but, as far as Jonny and Natalie are concerned, the earlier the better! 'Our enrolment and induction process means it takes a little time before we can introduce a new volunteer to someone. If a potential volunteer contacts us in early December, we may not be able to get them introduced before Christmas. We are encouraging people to think about getting involved now so that volunteers can get started well before the festive season takes over! If you'd be interested in making a real difference to someone else's life - not just for Christmas but in the run-up to it and beyond - then Jonny and Natalie would love to hear from you. You'll need to be 18 years old or over, willing to undergo a DBS (police) check (which will be arranged at no cost to you) and provide two references, but in return you'll get induction training on the basics of befriending, the ongoing support of a co-ordinator and, above all, the immense gratitude of someone who will be so pleased to share some of their life with you.

Norfolk Coast Ponds Project

We are looking for volunteers to take part in pond survey work in the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty. In the first instance, we are looking for 2-3 people, this year into next, to work on a pilot to test a recording methodology. This will be followed next year, in the spring, by a survey of the coast's ponds, for which we seek assistance from several volunteers. Ponds are such an important habitat, serving as stepping stones in the wider landscape, linking areas and providing refuges for wildlife. We need to know more about them, where they are, what condition they are in and what wildlife they are supporting.
