October 2017**

Representatives from North Norfolk District Council (NNDC) attended the meeting and highlighted the new Government legislation for dog control. New dog orders are being developed

by NNDC and these will incorporate new signage which will hopefully be easier for owners to understand. One of the biggest problems is people picking up and then dumping their bags. Please adhere to the rules re dog-fouling and pick up and dispose of your animals' waste correctly - you know it makes sense. If there are any particular hot spots please report them directly via the NNDC website. Complaints are monitored and action taken where appropriate to do so. There is keen interest in developing a Community Speedwatch Team within the Parish. So far, we have two enthusiastic people and need another 5 to make a core group. It is not arduous and will send the right message to drivers who do not obey the speed limits within our parish. Training is offered and it would be good to see this initiative take off. Please call or email us to let us know your interest.

Gap and hope that funds may be available to help at this location.

are local folk and, unfortunately, there remains a hard core of owners - whether local or visiting - who do not feel it is incumbent on them to clear up after their dogs. Not only is this unpleasant and potentially dangerous, it reflects badly on the vast majority of responsible owners who are often on the receiving end of unwarranted abuse from those who are not as fond of our canine companions. Our dog wardens do try to educate, but remember that they can report offenders who are potentially liable for fines up to £1000. Please respect everyone who wants to enjoy our pavements, paths and beaches and make sure you pick up after your dog, and dispose of the results appropriately. Refusing to do so is, at the very least, an extremely selfish act.

Book Club

In September we discussed 'The Wine of Solitude' by Irene Nemirovsky. Though atmospheric in its depiction of a stifling childhood starved of love, most of us found this book lacking in substance. Two episodes stood out from this humdrum, lacklustre life where each character is dissatisfied with their existence. One was when the main character and her beloved French governess were lost in swirling fog in Leningrad after the revolution of 1917. The other was when, as a young woman, she experienced a momentary period of joy and freedom to frolic in snow in Finland. War and revolution serve as background to this coming-of-age story, they certainly do not take centre stage. The father is a gambler, in businesses as well as cards

and roulette. The mother is a spoilt, selfish woman who lives to be adored by men and is verbally abusive to her daughter. It is no wonder that the girl becomes bitter and vindictive.

In October we will have discussed two other books and distributed 'The Ghost Road' by Pat Barker and 'The Roundabout Man' by Clare Morrall. If you did not make the meeting but would like copies to try, please get in touch with me.

In November there is a play at The Assembly House called 'Climbing The Wall.' It is the story of two elderly women making a bid for freedom from their care home which appeals to our group. Also in November is 'Accidental Death of An Anarchist' by Dario Fo at Sewell Barn. There are two screenings in Cromer. 'Follies' in November is a National Theatre production of Stephen Sondheim's musical headed by the wonderful Imelda Staunton. In December 'Young Marx' is another National production and a new vehicle for the talented Rory Kinnear. There are two Theatre Royal offerings - 'Top Hat' in December and 'The Kite Runner' in March. Those that went to two musical events this autumn

reported that they were both enjoyable outings. The cast of 'Blood Brothers' received a standing ovation from a full house with Lyn Paul being outstanding in her portrayal of the mother forced to give up one twin son for adoption. Adult actors played the young sons growing up in their separate lives and the liveness of one was commented on. This gritty story with its appropriately emotional music was delivered by first class actors. 'Beautiful' is the story of Carole King who wrote songs from age sixteen for many well-known performers before singing those she wrote for herself. There were different duos and trios performing these nostalgic songs. Apparently, the music was rather shrill in places and it was felt that the groups were better than the girl solo.

St Peter's Church, Ridlington

We have to thank the efforts of Sam for her wheat loaf, Lyn who decorated the church and Barbara for manning the produce stall in preparation for the Harvest Festival.

The finest Harvest Festival to be held in the village in Leicestershire where I used to live was reckoned to be in 1947. The rector, Ted Fisher (a relative of the Archbishop of Canterbury who crowned our present Queen) helped with the harvest on my dad's farm,

along with other able-bodied men from the village. My dad, being considered a generous man (a view not entirely shared by his two sons), hoped to raise money for a Village Hall so, fired up by his experiences, the Rev Ted gave such a sermon of fire and brimstone that the collection plate was overflowing - Catherine, take note!

I would like to thank Charlie Frisby for his recollections of the 1947 Higham Harvest Festival. Although now ninety, in his younger days Charlie was master of the Oasten Basset Hounds who

chased hares but didn't kill them and everyone followed on foot.

Even not so long ago a week's bad weather could ruin a harvest, but, in 1378, the year prior to the Black Death, it was a very difficult harvest, which led to widespread malnutrition, leaving people especially vulnerable to the disease. We have to give thanks for modern technology.
