Bacton Flood Gates

9DF Bacton has 3 flood gates that are controlled and maintained by NNDC and supervised by our flood wardens. Their purpose is to help keep the public safe and not just from flooding. They are only closed when NNDC is advised by the Environment Agency and the Met Office that there may be the possibility of dangerous weather conditions affecting our coast.

> NNDC pays a contractor to close and open the gates as was done on 1st - 5th March because of persistent high winds. As an aid to drivers who access Mill Lane and Newlands Estate through our middle gate at the end of Beach Road, we place gate is shut. No physically easy task.
