Bacton & Edingthorpe Parish Council Meeting 9 November 2015

Councillors were really pleased to learn that Little Pirates would like to utilise the Pavilion for their weekly meetings. We will be working with the group to provide them with support over the next few months during their transition period.

The Council were thrilled that Sally Dunham has come forward with an army of volunteers to manage the Children's Christmas party - thank you to all. The date is Saturday 12th December - contact Sally or myself if you would like to attend and details were in the previous edition of the Village News.

The Precept is the portion of the Council Tax which you pay to your Parish Council to manage your local services - grass cutting, managing, maintenance of,

and improvements to, the Pavilion, play area, car park, emptying of village rubbish bins, glass bottle banks to name but a few duties and responsibilities -.the list is endless.... The Council are pleased to announce that there will be no increase to the Council's overall Precept request this year. However, the portion of the Government's grant towards the Precept (the part which the Government supports as a subsidy for those who are unable to pay their Council Tax) has been reduced. Therefore, there may be a slight nominal increase to each householder to account for this.

The Coast Road, proposed Car Park was discussed at length again and it was resolved that the Council would not take on the burden of providing this facility at a financial cost to the community. However, the Council would support any resident(s) who would

like to work on this project as a Trust and assist them as necessary. If there is anyone who wishes to progress this matter please let me know.

The new enclosed rubbish bin has been installed and we hope that this will help with the rubbish problem at the play area. A member of the public has come forward to litter pick the location on an ad hoc basis and they will be supplied with the necessary items to do so. If there are any other residents who might like to be involved please let us know. A new dog bin will be installed between the dog and (non) dog beach, which will be emptied on a bi-weekly basis.

The Pond project in Edingthorpe is moving forward slowly and the Council is working with the landowner, NCC Highways Department and other interested parties to tidy up the area.

We are still seeking ideas and volunteers for the Celebrations for the Queen's 90th birthday - 12th June 2016. We will remind you in the New Year.

If you have any ideas/projects or any comments regarding the management/running of your Council, please let the Clerk know by phone, email or post. This information will be forwarded to the

Council for their consideration.

The next meeting will be on the 14th December, 7 pm in Bacton Village Hall Annexe. All are welcome to attend.

An important element of the plans is notifying householders if and when they may be at risk and advising them on their options.

Bacton Flood Wardens

Sample Flood Warning Card

In the event of a Flood Warning, Flood Wardens will visit all properties considered to be at risk, to let them know the time of the anticipated danger period and if and when the Evacuation Centre (Bacton Village Hall) is to open. If there is no reply when they call, a brightly-coloured card will be left, providing these details - see picture. There is also a mobile number (07810 863 267) that you are asked to contact if you plan to make your own arrangements to leave your home - to stay with friends outside the village, for example. Once the Evacuation Centre is opened, this phone will be manned, but you can leave a message, which will be picked up as soon as the phone is activated. You will be asked to provide your name, the address you are

vacating, a contact number and any message. This will enable the Flood Wardens to a) know you are safe and b) let you know if/when it's safe for you to return home. Your details will be kept secure and not communicated to anyone other than the Emergency Services, should the need arise, without your express permission. You can also use this number to request assistance.

North Norfolk District Council (NNDC) and the Environment Agency have useful information on things to consider in the event of an emergency, including removing sentimental items to a place of safety if possible, remembering essential medication whilst you are away from your home and looking after your pets. Please remember that, if you opt not to evacuate when advised to do so by the Flood Wardens, not only are you putting your household at risk, but also the Emergency Service Rescue Teams.

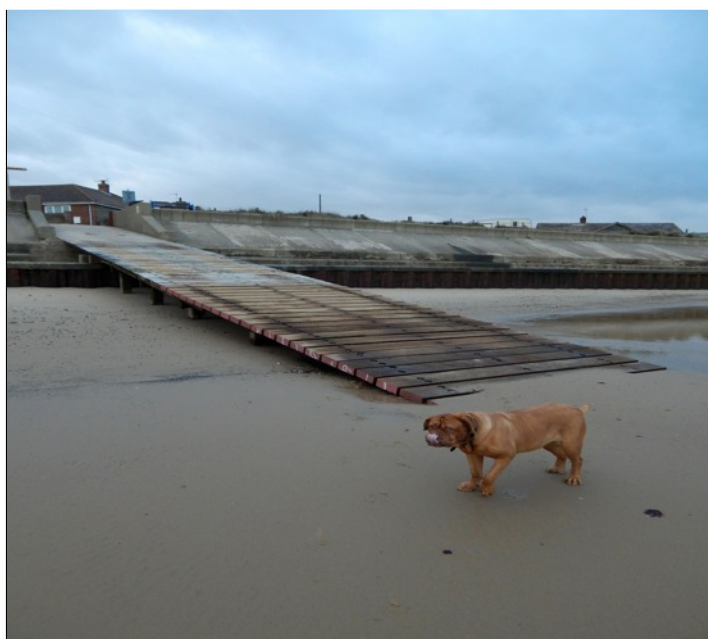
