Bacton & Edingthorpe Parish Council Meeting 8th February 2016

Looking forward this year, we have the Queen's 90th Birthday Celebrations to plan and hope that the community will be supportive of this initiative. The date will be the weekend of Saturday/Sunday 11th/12th June 2016 and it is hoped that this will be another successful event for our Parish following on from the Queen's Celebrations in 2011. Ideas are just gathering pace and we should have some firmer plans in March. Watch this space for more information. If you would like to be involved or have any ideas, please let us know. The Council were pleased that Committee Members from Bacton Football Club attended the meeting to give an over view of the club to date. It is always good to see people passionate about their clubs

and to learn of their total commitment to their sport. Members will be working with the club to ensure that any reasonable requests are agreed to. We have had some minor vandalism at the Playing Field which is extremely disappointing. A children's swing has been damaged and a report was received of a vehicle trying to pull out the metal poles around the play area perimeter. Please be vigilant - if you see anything, alert the Police immediately. Amended plans for the land to the rear of the Duke Public House were received and have been approved by the Parish Council. Comments were made with regard to the issues with drainage and sewerage together with the number of car parking spaces. These are being built for Victory Housing. The Edingthorpe Pond Project - we are seeking volunteers to help with clearance of wood from the

pond for the landowner to then clean this out in autumn 2016. If you can assist in anyway, please let us know. Any help would be more than welcome.

It was sad to learn that Bacton Bowls Club has now disbanded and it is a great shame that this village asset will no longer used for a bowling green. We would like to extend our thanks to the committee who tried in vain to recruit new members in order to keep the club viable. If there is anyone in the community who has any ideas for this area, please again let us know.

We are endeavouring to develop a guide/information booklet for Bacton & Edingthorpe to promote the area. If you would like to be involved and advertise your business or properties to rent we look forward to hearing from you.

If you have any ideas/projects or any comments regarding the management/running of your Council, please let the Clerk know.

We are ALWAYS seeking volunteers for various functions within the community - please call us to find out how you can help. Contact by phone, email or post. This information will be forwarded to the Council for their consideration.

Home-start is a national charity with hundreds of schemes in local communities, empowering families to cope with the

day-to-day challenges of raising a family, the ultimate result being that the family are able to leave the service and 'go it alone.' Volunteers (all parents themselves and, in some cases, also grand-parents) are recruited to provide practical and emotional support to families who have at least one child under the age of 5. Each family is carefully matched with their own dedicated volunteer who will visit each week for between 2 and 3 hours and give support where the family feel they need it.

Funding has been secured to expand the service into the area between Holt, Cromer, Sheringham and North Walsham so new volunteers are required. Volunteers use their own life experiences to help families who are facing challenges such as isolation and loneliness, mental illness, bereavement, disability or families where another pair of hands relieves the pressure.
