Bacton Flood Wardens

On Saturday 10th October we were part of a training exercise with NNDC and the emergency services to practice our response under a Severe Flood Warning. Learning from the surge of Dec 5th 2013, procedures have been improved and,

along with the EA's increasing accuracy and more targeted warnings, we hope to continue to be as prepared as possible.

We worked with as many of our wardens that were available (as we do every call out) watching, warning, and reacting to different incidents presented by the organiser. The Evacuation Centre (the Village Hall) volunteers successfully handled all the many different demands from both visitors, observers, emergency staff and "evacuees" manning the dedicated emergency phone, radio, booking in and out and keeping the hot drinks flowing.

Testing our communications with each other and the emergency services was a very important part of the exercise and highlighted an improved procedure as well as the need to have more volunteers to cover additional tasks.

We do need more flood wardens to enable us to work in pairs for safety and also to cover absence, illness or infirmity! We have been fortunate with the weather this year but are now heading into winter. If you enjoy being outdoors, watching the tides (whatever the weather!) occasionally, are prepared to get to know all areas of our village and would like

I am pleased to report that some more people have joined our group and especially as one of them will drive into Norwich! Unfortunately two people could not make it to Terence Rattigan's 'A Deep Blue Sea' at the Maddermarket but Maureen and I were glad we did. It was a thought-provoking play with a powerful performance by the female lead, portraying a woman trapped in a hopeless relationship with a man incapable of returning her love. It was authentically

set in the 1940s with few props and dreary colours. By contrast the musical, 'Dirty Rotten Scoundrels' at the Theatre Royal was full of vibrant colour and smart, slick scenery supporting the equally ebullient and slick con men operating on the French Riviera. Previously a film starring Michael Caine and Steve Martin this story adapted well to being a musical and I particularly enjoyed the jazzy numbers with contemporary lyrics - great fun.

It took me a while to appreciate the adaptation of 'Rebecca', which we saw in September, as I had not expected to see much comedy in this dark and mysterious story. It was a packed audience and everyone was laughing and although the comic acting was over the top, I got drawn in.

Bacton Remembers WWI

Sergeant Cyril Robert Leathers was born in October 1894 in Depwade, Norfolk, the son of Robert and Elizabeth Leathers (nee Furness).

By 1911, he was living in Bacton with his Uncle and Aunt, Henry and Lucy Blogg, working with his Uncle Henry as a House Carpenter & Joiner.

Cyril must have joined the 9th Battalion, Norfolk Regiment in September 1914. He did a year of hard training and was sent over to France, landing in Boulogne on the 4th October 1915. It is unclear why Cyril was brought back to England as the 9th Bn were not in battle at that time. He may have been wounded by shellfire. He was on the Hospital Ship 'Anglia' when it struck a mine and sank just a mile off Folkestone Gate on November 17, 1915.

Cyril had served in the army for just over a year and in France for a matter of days before heading back home for the final time. He was one of the 13 officers and 372 other ranks, in addition
