Book Club

'A God In Ruins' by Kate Atkinson proved to be another successful choice. Most of us preferred the companion book, 'Life After Life,' which was a very clever history of the first half of the 20th Century as experienced through one family, but we were pleased to find out how one of the characters fared in WW2 and pursued his life through the second half of the century. Teddy had been a kind, thoughtful boy interested in the natural world in the first book but in this one we see how he was catapulted into the horrors of war as a bomber pilot. He did not know if he would have a future and yet this book shows us what his future might have been. Whilst it is peppered with characters from the first book and reading about them was like meeting old friends, it also introduces us to Teddy's wartime comrades and his future daughter and her family. The episodes where these characters appear are wryly

We do not charge for overdue books, although a repeat loan charge may apply for hired items (eg DVDs, games, CDs, and spoken word formats) not returned on the due date. A replacement charge may apply if items are lost or stolen.
