WRHS GROWN PLANTS

The following plants are being raised from seed in the WRHS poly-tunnel, and will be available for sale: Broad Beans, French Beans, Summer/Autumn Cabbage, Celeriac, Celery, Indoor Cucumber, Leeks.

WHAT TO DO THIS MONTH

Plant onion sets from mid-March, 4" (10cm) apart, 12" (30cm) between rows.

Push sets into soil so their tips are just showing. Cover with fleece until well established, to avoid bird damage.

Plant Jerusalem artichoke tubers and asparagus crowns.

Prepare trenches for runner beans with well rotted manure and shredded paper in the base.

Feed the slugs! Or set out your slug traps and share a bottle of beer with the blighters.

Mulch borders with organic material, keeping it away from the bark of trees & shrubs to avoid rot.

Prune established bush & standard roses; <u>feed</u> them as they come into growth.

Indoor sowing of sweet peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, aubergines, celery, salads and globe artichokes.

Disinfect pots & seed trays with Jeyes Fluid before planting seeds to avoid damping off.

Chit early and main-crop potatoes.
