

Margaret Jane Ferris, 25, for stealing a quantity of bedding and other articles, entrusted to her care, the property of Daniel Brown and Ann Catchlove, was sentenced to two terms of three months' hard labour, the second to commence at the expiration of the first.

Samuel Wheatcroft, 21, waiter, also pleaded guilty to stealing a watch and chain, suit of clothes, and 50s in money, the property of his brother, O. J. E. Wheatcroft, and was sentenced to six months' hard labour.
