ANOTHER OPPONENT TO VACCINATION.—The Tapton Tollbar-keeper, *Martin W. [REDACTED]*, was charged by Herbert Shaw, public prosecutor, with not complying with an order from the magistrates to have his child vaccinated. Defendant repeated the defence he made a few weeks ago, viz., that as he was a tollgate-keeper he was exempt from the operation of the Vaccination Act, and that, consequently, the Bench had no jurisdiction.—The Bench told the defendant he had his remedy if he thought they were wrong. He would be fined £1, and 15s. cost, a sum of money defendant said he should certainly not pay.

POUND BREACH AT NEWBOLD.—*George Lee* was summoned by Wm. Heath, for unlawfully releasing an impounded pig, at Newbould, on Sunday, the 17th inst. The complainant's son, who acts as deputy for his father, the pinder for the parish of Newbould, and Samuel Parkin, proved the case. . . . Mr. Jones, for the defence, contended that no case had been made out, as the particular pig could not be identified.—Mr. Fowler considered the identification of the pounded pig sufficiently made out. Fined £1 and costs, or 21 days' hard labour.

Arthur Vetter was fined 14s. 6d. including costs.
