Shropshire Wildlife Trust reserves: flora and fauna of Llanymynech Rocks, Llynclys Common & Dolgoch Quarry

Saturday 30th June (& 1st July if numbers warrant it, so please book early as minibus needs to be booked) **Cost: £17** (including gift for SWT) **Depart from Splash at 07.30** (return mid-evening) **Limit 15**.

Take a packed lunch & we will stop at the Fish & Chip shop in Leominster on the way back for a take-away.

The three SWT reserves that we hope to visit are all limestone (calcareous) landscapes. The area was once a hive of industry, but is now a peaceful wildlife haven that straddles the English/Welsh border.

- During our visit to Llanymynech in the morning on the 30th we shall be accompanied by Fiona Gomersall, a skilled field botanist and the SWT conservation officer. There is a profusion of limestone-loving plants found here, including bee and pyramidal orchids and common rock-rose Together with the aromatic herbs, the plants provide nectar for the many butterflies, including the Pearl-bordered Fritillary and Wall Brown, that can be found here. It is one of the best butterfly strongholds in the area and the Trust works with Butterfly Conservation to manage the landscape appropriately.
- After lunch we will move on to Llynclys Common which comprises woods, meadows, scrub, old quarries, sunny glades and a pond. This variety of habitats makes it a great place for birds, plants, butterflies and moths.
- If time permits, we shall visit Dolgoch Quarry with its 2 ponds, another stronghold for a variety of flowers, and here the limestone strata may provide views of fossils because they lay in a shallow sub-tropical sea many years ago.
