Smoking Dogs

Just in case anyone missed the latest email from our secretary....

As I am sure you will have noticed there is an increase in four legged members of the club making regular visits to the field (including our own dog, Harley) Whilst their arrival is not unwelcome I have been asked to make the following plea to owners regarding the control of their dogs.

Regardless of whether you are shooting or collecting please ensure that your hound remains behind the **WAITING LINE** at all times. Once the range is set up dogs must not be allowed past the shooting line under any circumstances. I can recommend a couple of local shops who will gladly sell you a ground spike and long line which will allow your dog a degree of freedom without it causing a distraction to other archers or putting itself in danger from arrows. I would also remind you that should muttley make a deposit on the field it is your responsibility to clean it up. It would also be appreciated if any such deposits are disposed of properly (there is a poo bin right by the entrance to Langney Sports) rather than being festooned upon the local trees! The club cannot be held responsible for any injuries or damage caused by, or indeed to, your dogs so please do keep them under proper control.

I have also been asked to remind those of you who do feel the need to smoke that, smokers are kindly asked not to smoke on the shooting line at any time or anywhere where their smoke can drift over other members, especially juniors. This applies to e-cigarettes as well.

RECORDS OFFICER RAMBLINGS

Due to the changes to the Rules of Shooting effective April this year, all references to FITA have now been changed to WA (World Archery). This means that all FITA rounds have been renamed e.g. Gents Fita is now WA 1440 Gents; Ladies Fita is now WA 1440 Ladies. The Fita 70 is now WA 70 etc. All Fita indoor rounds also now start WA. Club records relating to these rounds have been renamed and we should start to use the new names immediately. I won't penalise you if you forget.....yet! but it is not going to go away and we should get used to the change! I personally dislike it!!

AND NOW FOR SOMETHING COMPLETELY DIFFERENT....!

After the success of our St. Leonard's round earlier in the year, we held the second historical/foreign round day today (Sunday 22nd June). The weather was gloriously warm, which was fitting considering the names of some of the rounds we were shooting, Tropical, Australian and Malayan (nobody fancied the Metropolitan (perhaps the name was too English))! We could have managed without the strong head/side wind, but, hey, this is Eastbourne, we don't expect anything different.

These rounds were taken from a historical list from Australia and were chosen for the mix of odd combinations of distance coupled to odd numbers of dozens, all shot on a 122 cm face. Each round was eligible for a Club Record, which could only be claimed when shot today.
