What is Neighbourhood Watch?

Neighbourhood Watch is about being part of a community team whose members work to protect each other from crime and anti-social behaviour, to improve the quality of life in their area and to ensure everyone in patch can feel safe. NHW promotes community safety by increasing crime prevention awareness, greater vigilance, opportunities for crime and fear of crime by enhancing responsible citizenship, neighbourliness particularly among the more vulnerable, elderly and young members of the community.

Safer Neighbourhoods Police team

Safer Neighbourhoods is a truly local policing style: local people working with local police and partners to identify and tackle issues of concern in our

neighbourhood. Each ward has a Dedicated Ward Officer and Police Community Support Officer. More officers work flexibly across a larger neighbourhood area in support of the dedicated team, all led by a Sergeant and an Inspector. Safer Neighbourhoods teams spend most of their time out on patrol in our neighbourhood, meeting the community, identifying and dealing with those crimes and issues we have told them cause us most concern.

London Fire Brigade

Together with the LFB, we have provided several fire safety talks in patch. If you think your neighbours could benefit from a fire safety talk or if you would like a free home fire safety visit, please contact us. Firefighters stress every home should have at least one working smoke alarm per floor. Working smoke alarms are essential as they provide vital early warning and allow extra time to escape if there is a fire in your home. Test your smoke alarm every week. Change the battery when the low battery warning operates, however, never disconnect or take the batteries out of your alarm if it goes off by mistake. Do not try to remove batteries in 10 year smoke alarms as they cannot be removed or replaced. Know your escape plan.

- Keep a bucket of water or sand nearby for emergencies.
- Barbecues must be placed on level ground so

• Only use approved barbecue fuel or fire lighters. Never use petrol or paraffin.

Being alert, vigilant and calling in to the Police any incidents or suspicious activity, is all our responsibility. When you notice something unusual, no matter how trivial you think it may seem, phone it in. Your action will help reduce criminal activity and anti-social behaviour in our community.

1. Emergencies: 999

To report an emergency: immediate threat to life or property or a crime happening right now.

2. Non-emergencies: 101

To report a crime that has already happened, seek crime prevention advice or make Police aware of any policing issues.

Thieves see your possessions differently

The MPS has launched a new awareness campaign to urge people to take care of valuable items such as smart phones, tablets and jewellery. The campaign warns people that to a criminal their valuables mean instant cash and can attract unwanted attention. Keep your jewellery, mobile phone and all your valuables hidden. Don't tempt mobile phone thieves, be aware when making a call and beware of phone snatchers. #LoveYourPhone Keep your bags close to you, secured with zips closed attach a bell.

Lock it or Loose it

20,000 bicycles are stolen every year in Greater London. To deter and prevent cycle theft, follow the **three R's**. **Record**: keep a record of the frame number, make any other marks that can identify your bike if it is stolen. **Register**: your bike details onto online property databases such as BikeRegister.com This will help Police return any recovered bikes to the rightful owners and **Report**: if your bike is stolen in London, please report this to Police by calling 101 or online at https://beta.met.police.uk/ In an emergency dial 999. If residents would like their bike security marked, we can contact the Safer Neighbourhoods Police team to arrange a bike marking session. More on bike security.

Westminster Neighbourhood Watch Association (WNWA)

Westminster has introduced an Association to lead the way in how Neighbourhood Watch is run in Westminster Borough. Former Mayor of London, Boris Johnson, stipulated that each London Borough needs a Neighbourhood Watch Association in place as it will allow Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators to work with the council and police to support and improve NHW across Westminster. WNWA represents and supports all Neighbourhood Watches in the Borough of which there are currently over a hundred.
