### Another recipe for you to try

Lettuce Soup Serves 4

### **Ingredients**

50g (2 oz) Butter 125g (4 oz) Spring Onions 600ml (1 Pint) Chicken Stock Salt & freshly ground Pepper

### **Method**

Melt Butter in a deep saucepan. Sauté the roughly chopped lettuce and onions until very soft. Stir in the plain flour then add the stock. Bring to boil, cover and simmer for 45 minutes to 1 hour. Cool the soup, puree in a blender or rub through a sieve Return to the saucepan and add the milk and seasonings. Reheat to serving temperature

You can use up left over lettuce leaves, or if you grow you own the ones that have shot. The shade of green of the soup varies depending on the lettuce used.

Thou clears the head o' doited Lear: Thou cheers the heart o' drooping Care; Thou strings the nerves o' Labour sair, At a weary toil; Thou even brightens dark Despair.

Wi' gloomy smile. Aft, clad in massy, siller weed, Wi' Gentlesthou greets thy head; Yet humbly kind, in time o' need, The poor man's wine, His wee drab parrich, or his bread, Thou kitchens fine. Thou art the life of public haunts; But thee, what were our fairs and rants? Ev'n godly meetings o' the saunts, By thee inspir'd, When gaping they besiege the tents, Are doubly fir'd.

That merry night we get the corn in! O sweetly, then, thou reams the horn in ! Or reekin on a New Year mornin' In cog or bicker, An' just a wee drap sp'ritual burn in, An' gusty sucker.

When Vulcan gies his bellows breath, An' ploughmen gather wi' their graith, O rare ! to see this fizz an' freath I' th' lugget caup ! Then Burnewin comes on like Death At ev'ry chaup.

Nae mercy, then, for aira or steel; The brawni, banie, plough-man chiel, Brings hard owrenhip, wi' sturdy wheel, The strong fore hammer, Till block an' studdle ring an' reel, Wi' dinsome clamour.

When skirlin' weanies see the light, Thou make the gossips clatter bright, How fumbling culfs their dearies slight, Or pack frae them.

When neebors anger at a plea, An' just as wud as wud can be, How easy can the barley-bree Cement the quarrel ! It's aye the cheapest Lawyer's fee, To taste the barrel.

Alake! That e'er my Muse has reason To wyte her countrymen wi' treason ! But many daily weet their weason Wi' liquors nice, An' hardly, in a winter's season, E'er spier her price.

Wae worth that brandy, burning trash ! Fell source o' mony a pain an' brash ! Twinsmony a poor,doyit,drunken hash, O' half his days; An' sends,besides, auld Scotland's cash To her warst faes.

Ye Scots, wha wish auld Scotland well Ye chief to you my tale I tell, Pour plackless devils like mysel', It sets you ill, Wi' bitter, dearthfu' wines to mell, Or foreign gill.
