

Reporting of and Responding to Concerns

We would like to thank parents who follow our guidelines about reporting concerns i.e. to report these to the school. As a school we respond and deal with any concerns as quickly and as sensitively as we can. This includes any incidents observed in the playground. We advise parents to report these to the main office or to supervising staff and not to approach the child/children involved.

Please be aware that if any school concerns are discussed on social media, depending on the content and nature of any posts, this can become a police and/or legal matter. Therefore, we would advise against using social media for this purpose.

Our campus police officer PC Rae regularly delivers assemblies and talks to the children about the safe and appropriate use of social media as part of their Health and Wellbeing curriculum. PC Rae also advises the school and works with parents too as and when necessary.

Opening Up Learning



In Terms 3 and 4 parents will have the opportunity to come into school for an open classroom and some classes will be doing assemblies or short presentations. Next week we shall send out the termly overviews of what the children are learning and we hope you find these helpful.

School Uniform Reminder

The vast majority of our children are presented very smartly in school uniform and we are encouraging all pupils to wear school colours; school sweatshirts or plain blue (preferably) sweatshirts/cardigans jumpers etc. It really makes such a difference in school to see all pupils in uniform. This is particularly important for P7 pupils as they are the oldest pupils in the school and set the standard for the younger children. In addition, please note that football club colours or logos from any team are not allowed in school and this includes hats; scarves; shorts; jackets; pack lunch boxes etc. Thank you for your support with this.

Electives

During the past two terms, pupils have been participating in Electives on Friday afternoons where they have been able to personalise their learning by choosing an activity to attend for 45 minutes. The pupils work in mixed ability and age groups, giving them the opportunity to interact with children and staff from other classes. New blocks of electives begin on Friday 29th January. If you are able to offer your time to come along and support our electives, please complete and return the letter your child brought home this week.

Dyslexia Awareness Week

As you will be aware from previous newsletters, Kilmaurs Primary is working towards achieving the Dyslexia Friendly Schools Bronze Award. As part of our plan to help the children, staff and families of Kilmaurs Primary develop their understanding and awareness of dyslexia, we will be holding a Dyslexia Awareness Week from Monday 8th February to Friday 12th February. A variety of activities will be on offer to children and staff, as well as a workshop held on the Monday evening for parents and families which will offer information on how you can support your child with literacy.

Credit Union - Thursdays 8.45am

The Kilmaurs Cool Cash Club has started again in conjunction with the East Ayrshire Credit Union. Money can be deposited in accounts on Thursday mornings from 8.45am. Pupils should enter the school through the P1 playground. If you have completed an application form your child will receive an account number and a savings card when they make the first deposit. Money can be withdrawn at any time from the Credit Union office in Kilmarnock provided pupils are accompanied by an adult. If your child has previously had an account and requires a new saving card or an update on their balance, please contact Mrs Bradley. If any parents are interested in helping with the Credit Union, please contact Mrs. Bradley. This an excellent opportunity to learn new skills that support parents who are actively seeking paid employment or who wish to see and support financial education in action.
