Kilmaurs Primary is currently working towards becoming a Dyslexia Friendly School. We are raising awareness amongst pupils and the school community about individual learning differences and styles.



We aim to promote the positive ethos of Dyslexia as a learning difference and create a dyslexia friendly environment in all classrooms. Children have already being learning about dyslexia at weekly assemblies and we have a pupil group leading work in the school. We want to include our families in the journey towards attaining our Dyslexia Friendly School Bronze Award, so look out for information leaflets, questionnaires and letters about our progress.
