A survey was received from Louise Kirk, Outdoor Access Officer, however full costs associated with the project have not been provided. Louise has indicated that a report is still required from a civil engineer with regards to gabion/bridge work.

At this stage could we begin asking for estimates for the labour and aboriculture works?

Louise also mentioned that support may be available for the production of a Woodland Management Plan, which would be essential component in any application to funders.

Would the trustees agree to the submission of an 'Expression of Interest' to Ayrshire Leader? I have already spoken with Operational Manager, Sarah Baird about the project and she confirmed that it is a good fit with their strategic priority; Theme 4: Celebrate Our Natural Environment. An Expression of Interests does not require to be fully detailed at this stage. It's more about the organisation itself, how it fits with the strategic priority, the idea and where we are in the development process.

Consultation -Youth Activities

The attached report highlights the ... Unfortunately, a meeting was arranged at the end of the consultation for those who identified an interest in getting involved in a Dalry Young Persons Forum-one person attended. The plan to take participants on visits to successfully run youth centres within North Ayrshire was abandoned under the circumstances. This report however, builds on the Rural 21 Action Plan which highlights the need for a youth facility in Dalry and therefore provides further evidence to potential funders.
