There have been 13 hoax calls from the phone box on the Blair Road

There was a query from the floor about there being no direct telephone numbers for Kilbirnie Police Office. Sgt Murdoch explained that all calls. That are non emergency needs to go through 101 and emergency calls through 999.

Guest speaker - Garnock Valley First Responder Jordan Robertson

Jordan explained to the meeting. That the Garnock Valley First Responders have been going for the last 4 years. It is a voluntary group that covers Beith, Dalry and Kilbirnie but has covered as far as Troon and Howwood. It is not supported financially by the Scottish Ambulance Service.

They support local training I. The Garnock Valley with Defibrillator Training and First Aid Courses to local groups.

There is 1 ambulance to cover the Garnock Valley and they support this by going out to help on calls when the ambulance is on other more serious calls.

They are looking to raise money as it costs approx £300 a month to run the service.
