3. Progress Public Park development

A children's football team has been started with up to 70 children attending. The park used to be lined for football but not now. Children have to play their home games at Kilbirnie. This is unacceptable. This matter will be taken up by Community Council.

A discussion took place re Growth Fund and the fact that Garnock Valley is not included in this.

4. Progress of sub groups

a. Lynn Glen

During heavy rainfall a bridge was washed away. This has now been roped off. There is a plan to reform foundations and replace. Bruce will look at this next week.

The Council have stated that the wall at the car park is not yet dangerous enough to warrant repair.

The Council have also stated that the road leading to car park is not their responsibility. This needs to be investigated given that there may be regulations concerning roads adjacent to traffic lights.

b. Fairy Glen

An Easter Egg Hunt will take place on 13 April. Support is being given by:

Sports Club will provide gazebo and tables

Big Fit Walk – this is being organized by Ruth. There was discussion re starting point. At present this will be the school but perhaps starting at the Cross would involve the community.
