1. Welcome, apologies and agree minutes

3. Progress Public Park development

No progress has been made since last meeting. Thomas Rainey had been at the park last week at a meeting with Colin Lyndsay, who takes junior football. 4. Progress of sub groups

Funding has been given for Carving Event. A meeting will be held at the beginning of May to discuss this with Marty McVey. Rather than an event where carvers are seen working this would be to celebrate the finished pieces. The picnic area not being big enough for a large scale carving event to take place.

- c. Heritage Trail :

Rosearden Garden – NA had notified that 0.5m pillars would be a tripping hazard. A vote was therefore held (residents in immediate area of Garden) to find out feelings re 1.0m pillars.

5. DCDH engagement with DCC

DCC is networking with other Community Councils in Garnock Valley. Through CIF funding Participatory Budget Events are to be held. At these groups will apply for funding.

A Youth bus will be visiting each of the 3 towns. This will attempt to look at the bigger picture of the needs of the young people. Community workers will ask young people what works and what they want. Their schedule will be 3 visits to each town with 2 being night visits.
