

Other Information

We recently went on some very interesting training called 'Let's Talk More' which is an initiative to identify and support children at risk of communication, speech and language difficulties. It was about the massive impact communication as a whole, not just speech, has on a child's overall development including cognitive, emotional and social development as well as general well-being. The program screens children between the age of 2yrs and 2yrs 11 months that have been identified as needing support and then inputs strategies for parents and professionals to work on which, in a lot of cases, give the child the support needed to improve without having to be referred to speech therapy.

We just want to share a couple of points that we found very thought provoking.

- A child who lives in a house that constantly has a radio or TV on gets used to hearing talking voices/noise all
 the time so when you then speak to them they think it's just that normal noise so don't respond. Try and give
 them at least 15 minutes with no background noise.
- When we say something to a child this is the process they have to go through so we need to make sure we give them the time to fulfil this process



 The impact of prolonged use of bottles and dummies can result in infantile swallowing patterns and lack of development in the muscles in and around the mouth that are needed to form words within speech

We are planning to post some more information in the settings soon. If you feel your child would benefit from support or you would like to know more then please speak to a member of staff.

Some basic reminders to everybody to help promote good communication development would be;

- Be face to face with your child
- Switch off technology and talk
- Try not to have noise or other distractions in the background
- Always respond to your child when they try to communicate with you (even if it's just a touch to begin with if you are talking).
