Uniform

Our uniforms can be bought from the school through ParentPay, Ayrshire Schoolwear, 7-9 Prince's Street, Kilmarnock, Tesco On-line and Walker & Templeton. School blazers can be braided with red or orange braid. If you are in receipt of Income Support, Jobseekers Allowance, Child Tax Credit, Working Tax Credit, Council Tax Benefit or Housing Benefit you may be entitled to a clothing grant and/or free school meals. Application forms are available from the school office.

Congratulations to Mr and Mrs McPhail on the birth of their baby daughter. Mother and baby are doing well!



Headlice

We have recently had a few cases of head lice in school. Head Lice are caught from close head to head contact with an infected person. Young children are particularly vulnerable because head to head contact is more common in this age group. Momentary, close contact is enough. Prevention - look out for symptoms of head lice. Perform weekly checks to look for nits and head lice in your family's hair. Keep long hair tied back. Avoid sharing combs and brushes with other people. Avoid wearing other people's hair accessories (hairbands, scrunchies), caps or hats. It would be appreciated by the school if you could let us know of any outbreak - all information will be treated in confidence.

Homework Questionnaire

Thank you to all who responded to our questionnaires about homework. The most recent request for information resulted in 131 responses which gives us a good sample of your views. The previous Survey Monkey survey of the same questions produced over 100 responses and the results are very similar. There are significantly more parents and carers who wish homework than don't and the clear majority stating the amount of homework is about right, although comments give views on what would make the homework more effective. Thank you to all who offered to be part of a homework group to review and update homework policy to reflect your views. This will be challenging as there are different views on how homework is set and how often, however, I wish to address these issues prior to the start of the new session to have a more "joined up" approach. I will contact the 26 parents/carers who ticked the box to be involved, to invite you to a meeting to discuss the issues raised, as well as the many positive comments which enables us to build on existing good practice. We are committed to providing worthwhile experiences which provide you with information about your child's learning. I appreciate your support and will provide further information once this meeting has taken place.


Gaelic Feis


