#### Headlice

We have recently had a few cases of Head Lice in school. Head Lice are caught from close head to head contact with an infected person. Young children are particularly vulnerable because head to head contact is more common in this age group. Momentary, close contact is enough. Prevention - look out for symptoms of head lice. Perform weekly checks to look for nits and head lice in your family's hair. Keep long hair tied back. Avoid sharing combs and brushes with other people. Avoid wearing other people's hair accessories (hairbands, scrunchies), caps or hats. It would be appreciated by the school if you could let us know of any outbreak - all information will be treated in confidence.

### UNICEF UK

We joined UNICEF UK's OUTRIGHT campaign and spoke out on promoting and protecting the rights of the children affected by natural disasters. We have been working very hard, putting children's rights at the heart of everything we do in school. On Friday 20 November, pupils celebrated the anniversary of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. They completed activities. The Rights Respecting Ambassadors even wrote to David Cameron, hoping he will share their views and ensure children's voices are heard at the first ever World Humanitarian Summit in May 2016. The school have been working very hard at promoting children's rights in school and around the community and are passionate about continuing to spread this message.






RIGHTS RESPECTING SCHOOLS




## Road Safety
