

Update 10 – Derby resignalling

10 October 2018

In the early hours of Monday morning, three hours ahead of schedule, the final pieces of equipment and machinery were removed and the lines to the north of Derby station were handed back to East Midlands Trains and CrossCountry to allow the full train service to resume for the first time since Sunday 22 July.

Network Rail would like to thank passengers and local residents for their patience while we carried out this vital work.

The project in numbers

As a £200 million project, there were always going to be some big numbers involved. Here are just a few:

Benefits to passengers

- New 320 metre platform
- New, more efficient track layout that will remove the previous bottleneck to the south of the station
 - Increased track speeds from 15mph to 30-40mph
 - Reduced journey times
- Improved platform space for passengers, new facilities and a new retail outlet
 - Reduced barrier down times at Spondon level crossing

Other work in the area

When Network Rail undertake a piece of work that requires an extended line closure, we look for opportunities to complete other work on the same stretch of line. Whilst it isn't always possible, especially when we have a lot of engineering trains running, we did manage to add some additional work into the possession:

We held a number of community rail days at Matlock, Matlock Bath, Cromford and Ambergate stations – thank you to our partners who help organise these events.

At Cromford station we did some canopy works, repaired/replaced copers, general platform repairs and took the opportunity to check the track drainage system.

At Matlock station we refurbished the platform canopies as well as the platform copers and tactiles.

In addition, we also carried out a number of maintenance surveys, some devegetation work, installed some new road rail access points to the railway and various other work.

Level Crossing at Spondon station

Work at Spondon station and the level crossing has been successfully completed.

We have:

- Installed new laser obstacle detection systems
 - Installed a new crossing
 - Removed a redundant freight line
- Re sited the barriers and "wig wag" lights to reduce the length of the crossing
 - Realigned the highway to the south side of the crossing
 - Resurfaced the highway, including over the crossing
- Brought back into use the redundant part of platform 2 which was necessary as a result of new signal installation
 - Resignalled through the area
