

Walks through the Matlock Parks

The five Matlock Parks can be enjoyed individually or combined to provide a continuous walk between Matlock and Matlock Bath. These parks are owned and managed by Derbyshire Dales District Council and have, in recent years, been carefully restored to their former glory.

Visitors may enjoy an evening stroll through the historic riverside parks in Matlock and Matlock Bath. Those feeling more adventurous may walk to the top of the limestone cliffs for spectacular views of the Derwent Valley above Matlock and Matlock Bath. The featured map and walk descriptions provide a range of riverside strolls or short walk options to suit all abilities.



Hall Leys Park and Pic Tor

From Matlock station, follow the fingerposts over the river bridge to Hall Leys Park which, retains many traditional features and has fine views of Riber Castle. Follow, the wide avenue of trees through Hall Leys Park, to the southern end.



For Pic Tor and Matlock Bath, follow signs over a little wooden bridge and turn right along the path between the cliffs and the River Derwent. A signed path to the left winds its way up to Pic Tor War Memorial with views over Matlock. Return by the same route to Hall Leys Park and Matlock town centre where a range of restaurants featured in this guide can be enjoyed.

Over High Tor from Matlock to Matlock Bath

For those walking to Matlock Bath, the main path continues along the Derwent to a river bridge, where you turn left under the railway line and uphill to the gateway into High Tor. The path leads steeply uphill through trees and grassland meadows, passing several viewpoints of Matlock, before reaching the summit.



The top of High Tor, at 300 feet, is one of the highest inland cliffs and a popular rock climbing spot, so please take extreme care near the cliff edges. The main route continues along the summit, whilst the adventurous can take "Giddy Edge", a narrow signed path along the cliff edge (this may only be walked in the direction of Matlock Bath). The paths re-join on the other side of the summit. The path then zigzags downhill through ancient woodland emerging above the cable car station for the Heights of Abraham.

From here, the path alongside the railway line can be joined, which leads to Matlock Bath station and the numerous gift shops and restaurants of North and South Parade in Matlock Bath. The walk from Matlock to Matlock Bath via High Tor should take 45-60 minutes to complete allowing plenty of time for a stroll and refreshments in Matlock Bath, before taking the train home.

Lovers' Walks and Derwent Gardens

From Matlock Bath station, the entrance to Lovers' Walks is signed through the station car park. The walk enters woodlands rich in wildflowers, part of an area of Special Scientific Interest. The walk follows the steeply, stepped path to the summit from where you get impressive views of Matlock Bath. Throughout the woodland, various steep paths are signed from the cliff top walk to the surfaced riverside path below.



Cross the footbridge at the south end of the Lovers' Walks to the delightful Derwent Gardens with their many ornamental pools and fountains fed by the thermal springs, alongside the quirky grottos and alcoves built from the local "tufa" rock. The exit from Derwent Gardens is at the Grand Pavilion at the front of which is a little fishpond with ornamental fish. A shorter, level walk, suitable for pushchairs and disabled persons' access, can be enjoyed along the riverside section of Lovers' Walk from Jubilee Bridge to the bridge back over the river into Derwent Gardens.

Summer Evenings on the Derwent Valley Line

Enjoy long summer evenings in Matlock Bath and Matlock. Leave the car at home and travel by train on the scenic Derwent Valley Line. The 'Matlocks' have enticed visitors for over 200 years, attracted by the thermal waters, impressive landscape and spectacular views. Discover this summer, why they remain such a great place for an evening out.

Evening train fares are just £3 return from Derby, Duffield and Belper, £4 from Long Eaton and £6 from Nottingham, Beeston and Attenborough to any Derwent Valley Line station.

An extra warm welcome is assured to rail travellers from the restaurants, pubs, ice cream parlours and fish and chip shops listed in this guide, which are all offering a range of great discounts for rail ticket holders. See the listings pages for details of these great offers. These fantastic offers and great evening train fares will make an evening out in 'the Matlocks' hard to beat.



The special evening train fares apply after 1815 Monday to Saturday and after 1630 on Sundays. The train services that the evening fare is valid for are listed on the back cover of this leaflet.

Terms and Conditions of Discounts

All discounts in this leaflet, are only available on presentation of a valid train ticket to Matlock Bath or Matlock for that evening's travel. Discounts are only available after 7pm Monday to Saturday and 6pm on Sundays between 23 May and 3 September 2011. All the places listed are open daily, serving food and drink until at least 9pm, unless stated. Occasionally, some shops may close earlier due to inclement weather or other reasons.

Matlock Bath

This Special Summer Evening Fare offering great opportunities to enjoy the delights of the Derwent Valley Line, operates between 23 May and 3 September 2011 inclusive.

- £3 return from Derby, Duffield or Belper to any station between Derby and Matlock.
- £4 return between Long Eaton and any station between Duffield and Matlock.
- £6 return between Nottingham/Attenborough/Beeston and any station between Duffield and Matlock.
- These Special Evening Fares are valid after 1815 Monday - Saturday and after 1630 on Sunday for travel in either direction.

Groupsave

Throughout the day, great savings can also be made when three or four adults travel together for the price of two on a Groupsave ticket, with up to four accompanying children for just £1 each. Four adults and two children would pay just £12 return between Derby and Matlock Bath. Groupsave cannot be used with the special evening fare.

The promotional evening train fare and Groupsave tickets can be purchased from Nottingham, Beeston, Long Eaton and Derby stations or from the conductor on board the train.

This special evening fare is valid on East Midlands Trains services between Nottingham and Matlock and Cross Country trains between Derby and Nottingham. Groupsave cannot be used on Cross Country services.




