When does a Wood-pigeon slide along the ground on its back? Answer: when it is being dragged by a stoat! Thank you, Wendy Kruger, for this observation (including the black tip to the tail). Thanks also to Gill Burton who has given me a record of successful nesting by Spotted Flycatchers in her garden this year. Everyone who puts out bird seed will have seen Great and Blue Tits and occasionally Long-tailed Tits, but Val Ellis has had daily visits from a small black-headed tit which could be either a Willow or Marsh Tit. I have had one fleeting view so far but they are very difficult to distinguish so I phoned an old Monks Wood colleague. He told me that Marsh Tits breed regularly in most woods over 10 acres while 1994 was the last year Willow Tits bred at Monks Wood. Two years ago the Cambridge Bird Club included the Willow Tit in a county-wide survey of 'scarce woodland birds' and had very few sightings - another species in national decline. After an unprecedented warm end to October are you prepared for a 1963-type winter, as some forecast? *Meanwhile each severed leaf / Becomes a new good-bye – / The year's a callous thief.*
