NATURE IN EASTON 13

April, April, laugh thy girlish laughter/And, a moment after, Weep thy girlish tears! And now – What is all this juice and all this joy?... When weeds in wheels shoot long and lovely and lush. Spring has indeed sprung. You must all have seen Lesser Celandines and Sweet Violets, both deep blue and white, on verges and banks in the village, and the drifts of blackthorn flower that whiten the hedgerows. Have you also noticed the Primroses on the verge before High Park Farm drive, and the

patches of white Wood Anemones on both sides before Bigram's Farm? If you walk around the anemones you should see the uncommon, dainty little Goldilocks Buttercups there. Look out, too, for the rush-like spikes of Crow Garlic on the road verges before Shepherds Close; crush and smell them to check. I woke one morning at 5.30 a.m. to the clarion, twice-through, song of the Song Thrush. On the 7th of April, a Chiffchaff proclaimed the arrival of our first summer migrant with its metronomic 'chiff-chiff-chaff-chiff' (not to be confused with the resident Great Tit's shriller 'pee-chew-pee-chew'), and a week later I heard the fluty song of a Blackcap and someone saw a Swallow. Val heard a cuckoo on the 23rd up Hartham Street, but I still await the inconsequential warble of a Willow Warbler and the aerial flights of a Spotted Flycatcher to complete the clutch. From my study window, lunch-time, 13th: a large, very wet fox with an injured foreleg reconnoitred the Burtons' chicken run, jumped the Brook, ran into our drive and across the garden.

CHURCH ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

This was held on 30th March and the following were elected to the PCC: Mike Baker & Clive Wood (Churchwardens), Beth Davis, Peter Gould, Pauline Venables, Roger Silcock, Malcolm Halliday and Jenny Hyde. The annual accounts showed that although there was £8,644 available in the Fabric Fund for repairs, the essential day-to-day running costs of the Church showed a deficit of £462. The previous year's deficit was £171 and our reserves are only £2,000 so unless more money can be found for the running costs of the Church, we shall run out of cash in about four years time. It was suggested at the meeting that if they were made aware of the expenditure necessary just to keep the church open, such as insurance (£1,246) and the Parish Share that we pay towards the cost of having clergy available (£2,788), more villagers might wish to help with this expenditure. All gifts and donations can of course also be gift-aided and if anyone would like more information, any member of the PCC would be very pleased to explain further.
