After the warmest January night on record we are back to more seasonal frosty nights, but a bumblebee was busy one lovely sunny afternoon in my garden after a hard frost. If only global warming could stop at this In my December Note I mentioned endemic species in the south west ghats of India where there are several species of birds, mammals, frogs and many plants that occur nowhere else in the world. Britain has no endemic birds or mammals,

unless one counts the Scottish crossbill as a separate species from the continental one. There are, however, quite a few, mostly rather obscure, endemic plants that must have evolved when suitable conditions for them were more widespread but which have been left stranded in a few isolated places after the last Ice Age - like the Rhododendron arboreum in the Nilgiri Hills that I mentioned. They include several Whitebeams such as Sorbus minima on limestone rocks in one place in south Wales, Sorbus wilmottiana in the Avon Gorge, and Sorbus pseudofennica on the Isle of Arran, and also Primula scotica along the north coast of Scotland. Probably none of these would survive a much warmer climate.
