NATURE NOTES 42





Did you notice the horse chestnut trees on the way into Huntingdon looking very sick this summer, and elsewhere over much of southern England too? Close up you may have seen that the leaves looked very blotchy. This is all caused by little caterpillars of the Horse Chestnut leaf miner which turn into rather beautiful russet-coloured moths, about 5 millimetres long, with white bands across the wings. It was only discovered just over 20 years ago in Macedonia since when it has been migrating across Europe and entered England in 2001 or 2002. It is too early to know what effect it will have on the growth of the trees but should not kill them, unlike Weeping Canker which attacked our churchyard trees. Presumably, a parasite will eventually control its numbers. Talking of migrants, how far do you

suppose our regular visitors travel in a lifetime? Red Admiral butterflies can reach the Orkney Islands from southern France, some 1000 miles, but they don't go back. An Arctic Tern, which had been ringed as a chick in 1982, returned to the Farne Islands this year. The warden estimated that this bird had already flown 624,000 miles during its round trips to Antarctica and back over 26 years!
