NATURE NOTES 43 Brian Davis

Mike Baker and his merry lads felled a Leyland Cyprus in our garden recently as we thought it was getting a bit too big. Stretched out on the lawn, in fact, it measured just 58 feet or 17.7 metres in height and 22 inches or 55 centimetres across the stump. With 33 clear rings, this gives an average growth of 21 inches (just over half a metre) per year. However, my book on trees says that it can grow up to 40 metres tall with a diameter of 1 metre, so it still had plenty of potential. Whew! Interestingly, this inter-generic hybrid between Nootka cypress and Monterey cypress was produced spontaneously in both Ireland and Wales in the late 19th century when the two parents were grown close together in ornamental collections. Young male cones were already formed on our tree and there were clusters of mature female cones but these rarely bear fertile seeds so trees are always grown by striking cuttings. This is true also of the English elm which is thought to have been introduced into Britain by Neolithic Man, migrating from the Continent about 5000 years ago, and grown as hedges to contain stock. Unlike 'Leylandii', the English elm can spread from root suckers so that an entire hedgerow may really be one individual of indeterminate age and all trees in a clone susceptible to one introduction of Dutch elm disease.
