Hornets mating? No, these are Hornet moths, the largest of fifteen species of clear-wing moths found in Britain. I photographed them in the main ride of Brampton Wood on 19th June. The caterpillars live on the roots and lower trunks of poplar for about three years before emerging as adults. Unlike other moths, they rarely come to light traps, so they are generally under-recorded, but our local Moth and Butterfly Recorder, Barry Dickerson, has offered to come to try out some pheromones in our garden. These chemicals mimic natural hormone scents with which females attract males, and he has found them most effective in another friend's garden in Hilton. He is looking for three

species - Orange-tailed, Red-belted and Red-tipped clearwings - whose caterpillars live in old apple trees, willow trees and wayfaring tree, *Viburnum Lantana*, respectively, and we can provide all these. When I was a boy, I spent many hours searching poplar, aspen and sallow bushes in June and July for the 'aristocratic' caterpillars of Puss Moth and Eyed-hawk Moth. The habit dies hard and I have found five Puss Moth caterpillars this last week, which I shall introduce to my grandchildren.
