FARMER BURTON'S COUNTRY TALK



At this time of year it is normal to smell Christmas cakes cooking, not the smell of freshly mowed grass!! The mild weather and lack of rain is a real concern (yes, Geoff, us farmers are always complaining about the weather!). October is normally a wettish month but this year we hardly recorded any rain. This has affected wheat seed germination with fields looking 'patchy'. The rape was drilled (sowed) in mid August and got a soaking; it now looks well but I need to keep a close eye on all crops as this unseasonal mild weather can lead to disease and there are still aphids about which can cause problems later on.

We had our first shoot last week which went well. The bag (items that were shot) included pheasant, French partridge, rabbit, pigeon, and one fox. It was lovely to see an increase in both

English and French partridge on the farm, which is due to our Higher Level Countryside Stewardship and our time spent controlling vermin (carrion crows, magpies etc). We also saw flocks of small birds such as the finches feeding in the wild bird covers.

Last week our neighbour saw 8 foxes cross the road together up the Stonely Road when driving late one night. It is very likely that these would have been dumped after being caught up in a town and then released into the countryside but many do not survive as they lack the necessary hunting skills. (I hope they stay away from Lodge Farm!!). December is a time when I catch up with the jobs put off all year, such as paperwork and farm machinery maintenance and with the ODD day out shooting, there is always something to be done on the farm.
