# FARMER BURTON'S COUNTRY TALK

# 23<sup>rd</sup> Jan. 2013



At the start of any New Year, I often look back at the year that has just passed, and, boy, what a year! A record drought affected most of England in the early spring, one so severe it prompted a series of emergency meetings with the Government. All farmers prayed for rainfall and our prayers were answered in the worst possible way, with the wettest summer ever recorded! The rain and lack of sun stopped crops from growing and from ripening. We then struggled to prepare the land for sowing the autumn crops and the rain kept falling (maybe I should grow rice instead?!).
