FARMER BURTON'S COUNTRY TALK



As a new year starts, I wonder what 2014 will bring. With our weather out of character, all farmers hope for a balanced year. On New Year's Day I was greeted with a large bumble bee buzzing around Jills' cyclamen at our back door, which shows how mild it has been. I would like to moan (I can hear you saying that farmers don't moan!) about how wet our fields are, but after seeing how wet other parts of the country have been, perhaps I won't! I am concerned about disease that can be caused by very wet and mild weather: Yellow Rust is a problem in wheats this year. We could really do with a dry, cold patch and a few good frosts would be nice.

I have just spent the day at a farming event called LAMMA which was held at the East of England showground at Peterborough. LAMMA is the UK's largest farm machinery equipment show, with 800 exhibitors and 40,000 visitors, showing everything you could wish for your farm. (I was very sensible and left the chequebook at home!). The event is a bit like *Tomorrow's World* for farming (for those who can remember

Tomorrow's World!). In the future the emphasis will be on improving data management, field mapping and soil analysis to variable rate fertiliser/spray application and satellite positioning. Next it could be driverless tractors - good for my back, but would any of you be safe on the Easton roads?! Thankfully, these are a few years away from Lodge Farm!

It's going to be a busy month in the life of our churches! Jonathan's farewell service will be here at Easton at 11.00 am on 2nd February, and my licensing will be just a fortnight later on the 16th at 4.00 pm at Spaldwick St James. When you know that the average length of a vacancy in incumbency in the Church of England today is somewhere between one and two years, I think we can all be grateful that good planning has meant an immediate 'handover' for us.

We had an excellent joint meeting recently of the PCC's of Easton, Spaldwick and Barham and Woolley at which I was able to share some of my thinking for the future of our group and hear what people had to say. There was widespread support, and I hope to have an occasion soon when everyone who is interested can come along and contribute to the ongoing discussion. It was also the opportunity for me to outline a proposal for a Sunday service plan across the whole new group of seven churches.

February's service plan for Easton is broadly in accordance with recent tradition, apart from Jonathan's special service on the 2nd. So, there will be Evensong on the 9th at 6.00 pm, and a Communion on the 16th at 9.30am. From March there will be a slight readjustment of the rota, with the normal pattern being as follows: First Sunday of the month: 09:30 Morning Worship; Second Sunday 10:45 Communion; and Third Sunday 18:00 Evensong. On the Fourth Sunday there will usually be a communion at Spaldwick at 09:30 or at Stow Longa at either 15:00 (GMT) or 18:00 (BST).

I look forward to seeing you at any of the services, but your support at the licensing would be especially welcome; as would your prayers for me and for the rest of our ministry team as we embark on this new phase in the life of our parishes.
