## **NATURE NOTE 82**

If you go down to the woods today... you may be in for a big surprise. I am speaking of Shepherds Close - the little woodland nature reserve a mile along the Stonely road. If you walk up the perimeter path you will see that the large hawthorn trees at the top have been cut with high stumps and laid on their sides. This is to produce a jungle of new growth to attract birds (other than woodpigeons) to nest there. An earlier attempt was unsuccessful after the (low) stumps were simply killed by rabbit grazing. The reserve was planted up with a team from Easton just 30 years ago this winter, and with Steve Thomason I have been taking stock. Out of the 277 trees planted, only 109 have survived (40% overall – 64% for ash, 11% for oak) mainly owing to suppression by shading from fast-growing elm suckers and hawthorn, by summer droughts and most recently by serious ring-barking by rabbits during the period of thick snow

last winter. I can check the survival and growth of every tree because they were planted on a grid and labelled. James and Robert Burton will remember relabelling them with me in August 2010 and Steve Thomason and I have now done this again with help from Ed Sloper. It is interesting to note that the ash trees have grown much better in the lower half of the reserve and that they are, on average, more than three times the girth of the oak which have grown like bean poles to keep their heads in the sun but often just given up when 3-4 metres tall. A recent fungal foray group recorded 26 species, of which this Scarlet elf cap is the speciality of the reserve. We would appreciate a small work party here in March. Please contact me or Steve if you are able to help.

# CONNECTING CAMBRIDGESHIRE (BROADBAND UPDATE)

Here is an update from a briefing that was received in late January: New green cabinets are still being rolled out across Cambridgeshire. By the end of 2015 there will be 500 new cabinets in place. Twenty-three of the ones already installed have now gone live. The Connecting Cambridgeshire website (just type 'Connecting Cambridgeshire' into Google to find it) 'My Area' pages now link to an interactive map showing live cabinets in green and cabinets coming soon in white, which will be regularly updated. The nearest ones to us that are already live are Grafham and West Perry.

Checking on the *Connecting Cambridgeshire* website, it still confirms that Superfast broadband is forecast to be available in our area between June and September 2014. However, there is still the caveat highlighted that inevitably there may be some premises that turn out to be too far from a cabinet to receive faster speeds. The 'my area' pages show when areas can expect to get superfast broadband, and also have useful advice on "How to get superfast broadband" once cabinets are live. As well as keeping the Broadband Champions in the loop, *Connecting Cambridgeshire* will announce the new live cabinets by emailing local parishes and people who have registered for updates, on Twitter @ConnectingCambs and on the *Connecting Cambridgeshire* website home page.

Help for small businesses: *Destination Digital* will be officially launched in late February 2014 as part of the *Connecting Cambridgeshire* programme, which has won £4.5 million extra Government and European funding to help small and medium sized businesses afford better broadband connections and make the most of digital technologies. The scheme will offer grants in the form of vouchers to help Cambridge and South Cambridgeshire SMEs pay for high speed broadband connections, as well as free business support and grants to SMEs across Cambridgeshire and Peterborough to encourage companies to go digital. *Destination Digital* runs until March 2015 with funding and support available on a first-come, first-served basis.
