KATH GOODWIN aka "AUNTIE KATH"

This month's article is difficult to write, as many of you know that on Monday 21st September, Auntie Kath passed away. I think she was known as Auntie Kath to as many people as she was Kath Goodwin. We have had many cards from this wonderful village and the word "character" is mentioned time and time again.

Kath was born at Lodge Farm, Easton on 5th August 1927 and attended Spaldwick School (in the old village hall), and she would get there on her bike. She then attended Northfield School at Stonely (later called "Whispers"). At school she excelled in handwriting and maths.

At the beginning of World War 2 when she was 12, the country needed feeding, so she joined the farm and worked as hard as any man, running a 400 pig unit. She could carry a 12 stone bag of feed and stack bales better than most. When not working, Auntie Kath attended Spaldwick Young Farmers Club (often arriving in the Willy's Jeep) and, as with everything she did, was a keen competitor. In 1969 she married Bob Goodwin and she moved from Lodge Farm to The Lane and later into "Greenacres".

Kath loved this village and worked tirelessly for it over the years on the Parish Council, Easton United Charities and the Fund and Social Committees. She

loved to have a chat, was well known for her "Stirling Moss" driving and she will be missed by all who knew her. She will be remembered at a Memorial Service in Easton Church on Monday, 12th October at 2.00 p.m., after a private cremation.
