CUMPAN CEDVICEC FOD CEDTEMADED

Paul Minney has sent me this fine photograph of a Kingfisher seen for several days around their pond in Chapel Lane. Jill Burton has seen the same one, probably, at one of the ponds in the central field recently. This is one of our more uncommon and most beautiful birds, so people tend to comment and remember when they see one. Thus, Gwen Tomline used to see one occasionally around her pond at Oversland, and Michael Picton once recalled finding a dead one that had flown into his drawing-room window. Many years ago Stephanie Silcock saw one flying along the village brook, in the days when it held water all year round, and this may, indeed, have contributed to Easton winning the 'Best Kept Village' award that year, when Dr and Mrs Herzog came round as judges and heard about it! They nest in burrows in the banks of rivers and streams and gravel pits. The UK

population is around 4,000 pairs and the estimated population for the whole of Cambridgeshire is 50 to 200 pairs, distributed along the main rivers, but young birds may turn up anywhere. They feed on small fish and insects. I have occasionally seen small fish in our brook - minnows or sticklebacks - but they must have to migrate when the stream dries up, like now. Old field ponds, like those in the back gardens along Chapel lane, do retain water and must support fish and the aquatic larvae of damselflies and dragonflies, such as this Broad-bodied chaser that perched on my runner bean poles recently. This group of insects has survived since the Carboniferous era so know a thing or two about survival!

There are probably now only a few people in Easton who will still remember our house when it was the village pub. For many years it was owned by Huntingdon Brewery, at some time by Phipps Brewery, and finally by Watneys. It must have been a sad day for the village when Watneys eventually de-licenced the Crown in 1968. In the days before everybody had a car, it would have been the hub of village life – apparently not much notice was taken of the official closing time in the evenings! Cricket matches were held in the field behind the pub and teas provided in the garden. During harvest time the Crown was open all day for the people who came from outside the village to help to get the harvest in, before the days of combine harvesters.

We have a small collection of old photographs etc. relating to the pub and village and will be displaying these here at Crown Cottage from September 12<sup>th</sup>-30<sup>th</sup>.
