FARMER BURTON'S COUNTRY TALK

Issue 152

Weather patterns are important to UK farming: frost in December/ January and April showers! But this year we had no showers. Crops just started growing after a long Winter and really needed a valuable drink, but even more importantly for my recently-drilled Spring barley, which was starting to look very sorry for itself. We normally record 50/60mm in April but only had 6mm in 10 weeks, until finally the skies opened just in time on the 10th of May (with 36mm). What effect this will have on yields at harvest, we will have to wait and see.

So much has changed on our farm in the last year, such as growing Spring Barley, for the first time in 40 years, to combat the dreaded Blackgrass. Many of you can see this weed growing in fields around the countryside and it is the biggest threat

to cereal crops for many years. Here are 2 photos with and without Blackgrass. The lack of rain has stopped not only crops growing but also grass which would go for hay to feed cattle and horses. Normally, we would have done one cut by now and be

waiting for the second but we have only made one poor-yielding cut so far this year. If this is not enough for my fields to contend with, rabbits are another problem,

eating their way through my profit! I will make some time, in the early evenings, to reduce the number of these over the coming few weeks. Being herbivores, they graze on grass and love my crops! The female rabbit (called a doe) can have up to 12 in a litter and by day 30 the young will be weaned and the doe could be expecting again.

Over the last couple of months, I have been doing a lot of paperwork making my application to join the new Countryside Stewardship. It was successful and I will have half the farm down to nectar and flower mixes (to boost essential food sources for beneficial pollinators), buffer strips to prevent fertiliser runoff into ditches) and 24Ha of Two-year sown legume fallow (food for farmland wildlife, invertebrate chick food for birds). The only downside is that it will mean lots of record-keeping over the next 5 years to keep Natural England happy!!
