#### THE TREES IN THE CHURCHYARD AND PLAYING FIELD



Following the death of a young girl who was killed by a branch which broke off a tree in a public park in the Yaxley/Sawtry area, the Parish Council and the Church Council have been increasingly aware of their responsibilities for people's safety in public areas. Accordingly, we arranged for all our major trees to be inspected and the report from the

inspectors suggested that three trees in the Churchyard should be reduced to a small extent, and that the Ash tree in the corner of the Playing Field should be pollarded at about 15 feet.

Because the Churchyard is in a Conservation Area, we had to get permission from the District Council to do this work. That process took some months and then we obtained several estimates for the work to be done. The Churchyard trees do not look significantly different following the work but it is sad that the grand old Ash tree in the corner of the

## FREE COMPOSTED HORSE MANURE.



Each spring we offer free horse manure from Springfield, in Chapel Lane. The manure is left for at least 18 months to fully compost, and is then dug out and transported by the narrow-gauge railway for spreading back onto the fields, and some is also left on the driveway for neighbours to help themselves. It provides excellent compost for a range of flowers and vegetables. Typically, it will be available from Easter, so this year it will be available from the end of March onwards for about 4-6 weeks. You can bring your own wheelbarrow and take as much as you wish from a wagon left in the driveway each weekend, or alternatively just bring your car and load up with the bags of compost, also left in the driveway. For those who wish to have the bags delivered (within Easton) at the rate of £1 per bag (minimum delivery 5 bags), just ring Steve or Jan on 01480 891516 or email. <a href="thomsk@btinternet.com">thomsk@btinternet.com</a>. We can also arrange for manure to be available all year round if anyone has a need for volumes of manure outside of the above dates.

The manure is transported in wagons that were previously used in brickworks in Germany but are ideally suited to their new role of moving composted horse manure.
