1474	William Rodon, Rector, presented by Alianore, Duchess of Norfolk.	
1475	John Grenowe, rector, presented by Elizabeth, Duchess of Norfolk, and later the same year, Richard Wattys.	
1476	The last Mowbray, Duke of Norfolk died and the title passed in 1483 to Sir John Howard (who was killed in 1489).	
1480		Emme Gavel claimed the annuity left in her husband Thomas' will, from George Gavell, priest and Thomas Gault from the manor of Kirby Cane and Kirstead.

1492	Robert Bright, rector, presented by Elizabeth, Duchess of Norfolk.	
1497	John de Ellyngham buried in St. Mary's Church on the 21st May.	
1500	An inquisition made in Ellingham on February 8th before William Boleyn, knight Sheriff, Robert Curzon was siezed of a tenement in right of his wife Anne for her life, and of the manors of Parvowe in Ditchingham worth £6 a year, and Nobellys (Nevilles?) in Ellingham worth £4 a year.	
1502	William Alanson, rector presented by Elizabeth, duchess of Norfolk.	
1505	Richard Billington, rector presented by Elizabeth, Duchess of Norfolk.	John Pinchbeke rector of Stockton died leaving 11 acres of land in Kirkeby field, to his successors, with one acre and half in Winston field, to keep every year a certain and yere-day with messe and dirige; (mass and service for the dead) and to the church of Stockton, 11 acres of land in Winston; held from the Mowbrays.
