National Trust for Places of historic Interest or Natural Beauty

Since 1895 the Trust, which has charitable status, has worked for the preservation of places of historic interest or natural beauty in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. It now owns more than 620,000 acres, a large amount of coastline, and its buildings open to the public include stately homes, gardens, castles, barns, dovecotes – even two lighthouses!

Quite apart from the satisfaction of knowing that you are helping to protect some of the best of Britain's heritage, members enjoy free *entry* to National Trust properties (and those of the National Trust for Scotland), on presentation of a valid membership card. So, if you visit a number of NT properties during the year, you are likely to recoup most of the annual membership fee.

It is worth noting, too, that after five years' membership, people of retirement age are entitled to take advantage of a substantially lower annual membership fee.

Coach trips

Other activities

An annual Dinner is arranged for members and friends. An annual Quiz evening is always a popular social event, and monthly rambles during the summer months enable exercise and socialising.
