This month, and thanks to Tom Ibison for lending me a collection of old bulletins, I offer the following statistics from the 1990's when Fr. Pat McMahon was Parish Priest.

During that period four masses were celebrated each weekend – Saturday evening at 7.30, and at 8.00, 9.15 and 10.45 on Sunday mornings. The average Sunday mass attendance was 385.

Perhaps this was due in part to the fact that the 9.15am. mass was celebrated at St Luke's chapel in Whittingham Hospital? How things change; the weekly mass attendance now is circa 86! Mike Bryan.

Weekly Saint – 4th August - St. John Vianney: Born to a peasant family in Dardilly, France, John desired from a young age to be a priest. After years of difficult study in the seminary, he was ordained and assigned to the village of Ars, near Lyons. He brought Christ to his parishioners through the fervent celebration of the Eucharist, assistance to the poor, and above all, the sacrament of penance. Reputed to have the gift of seeing souls, he spent between eleven and sixteen hours a day reconciling sinners to God. Hundreds of pilgrims availed themselves of his aid every week. The cure was still hearing confessions from his bed a few days before his death on 4th August, 1859. M. Peel.
